## The Civil War

Phase One 1861-1863

## Phase One

- Both the Union and the Confederacy mobilized their economies and societies to wage the war even while facing considerable home front opposition.
- Although the Confederacy showed military initiative and daring early in the war, the Union ultimately succeeded due to improvements in leadership and strategy, key victories, greater resources, and the wartime destruction of the South's infrastructure.

## Phase One

Key Ideas to Understand:

- The Union blockade was a critical factor in winning the war.
- Union victories in the West were critically important to winning the war.
- In the North manufacturing, population, and agriculture were key advantages to winning the war.
- Having a strong central government under the leadership of Abraham Lincoln and the Republican Party (without Southern political opposition) was crucial to winning the war and creating a modern America.
